Twiggy the Water-Skiing Squirrel

Ready for some fun? Twiggy, the Water-Skiing Squirrel returns to St. Paul! Arguably the most famous squirrel around, this little critter will be showing off her amazing skills every day. Her trainer, Lou Ann Best, will be there to tell her story.

The very first Twiggy was rescued in 1978 by the Bests, after being blown from her nest during Hurricane David. On a lark, Chuck taught Twiggy how to ski behind his daughter's toy remote controlled boat. The rest is history. Twiggy's remarkable prowess caught the attention of the media, and she was on her way to becoming a star.

Of course, Twiggy is a safety-conscious critter, and insists on wearing a life jacket while skiing. She loves the attention from her fans, and is anxious for you to come see her. Several shows are scheduled throughout the run of the Sportsmen's Show.

Steve Porter's Trophy Whitetail

This impressive attraction, a Show favorite for several years, features three live Safari Club International-class bucks. New this year is young Heart Attack, three and a half years old, with 30 points, which would score about 240". Also new, four year old Magnitude only has 12 points, which would score about 190", but his huge 350 pound body supporting his "typical" set of antlers sets him apart from the crowd.

Five year old Double XL returns, this year with approximately 50 points. The current world record whitetail non-typical deer scores 333-7/8". Game farm deer are not eligible for the wild record book, but Double XL, with his 50 point rack, would score approximately 400".

Whitetail deer expert Steve Porter manages a 140-acre deer farm with 60 deer. He has taken his traveling live trophy whitetail display to more than 100 schools, His educational program covers the life of the majestic whitetail.

Fur-Ever Wild

Fur-Ever Wild is a working agricultural farm that celebrates our traditional connections to the land and resident wildlife, just as the pioneering trappers and hunters did, just as the ranchers and farmers of today do.

Featured at the Sportsmen's Show are some of Fur-Ever Wild's resident animals, all indigenous to Minnesota. Included are live wolves, bobcats, foxes, fishers, a cougar, porcupines and baby goats. Director Terri Petter will be there, too.

Live Trout Pond
